# **All-year-round Access**

Access: Open access land: all-year-round. Groups or large parties should refer to the notes on page 11.

Style: A useful and popular wall that offers a good range of climbs at mainstream grades. It is close to the 'squeeze' in the road, so don't expect peace and quiet. SSE-facing.

Ethic: Sport routes.

Approach: Roadside.

Descents: All descents are from abseil stations.

Rock Safety note: please be mindful of anyone beneath you; there is a risk that you could dislodge rock towards the pull-in or people on the slopes below. Also, wearing a helmet is strongly advised since rocks do regularly roll down the slope above the cliff.

#### 1 | Got One! 12m F5+/6a [6B]

An orange pillar on the left: F6a will be well felt if you stick on the wall.

#### 2 Sound Your Horn 12m F7a+ [3B]

The short wall met head-on; fingery.

### 3 Where the Sun Don't Shine 12m F6b [4B] ★

Climbable in the sunshine in summer: the centre of the short wall from a bolt belay.

#### 5 Maiden Flight 12m F6b [4B]

Smooth, hard-to-use holds; harder still after all those sweaty fingers.

#### 8 Like Father Like Son 18m F5 [7B]

#### 9 Drukpa Dzong 15m F5 [6B]

Contemplative small blank wall and rib starting from a bolt belay.

It's hard (F6b+) if you climb absolutely straight up the bare rib near the top. Using a ledge and layaway out right here is F6a (and there is a F6a+way of doing it between!).

Ramble up ledges; then attack the headwall direct. Good stuff.
